From Los Angeles: Currently, the Alfred Adler Society is sponsoring a course in "The Differential Diagnosis of Psychogenic Personality Disorders," a course for physicians and clinical psychologists, conducted by J. Peter Frostig, M.D. "The Psychoses" and the "Psychotherapeutic Approach to Psychosomatic Disorders" will be the subject of two courses to follow.

Three other classes have been conducted at the Institute for Individual Psychology in Los Angeles. A counseling demonstration class is directed by Paul Brodsky, a class in "Adolescent-Adult Relationship" by Mrs. DeVries and Walter Thomas, and a class "Introduction to Principles of Adlerian Psychology" by Dr. Sicher, Dr. Olma, Dr. Arnold and Paul Brodsky.

Dr. H. L. Ansbacher, Professor of Psychology at the University of Vermont, has been elected President of the Vermont Psychological Association.

Dr. Rudolf Dreikurs, Professor of Psychiatry at the Chicago Medical School, has been elected President of the American Society of Group Psychotherapy and Psychodrama.
