Robert D. Bradbury, Seattle, Washington, reports that he has met a fellow Adlerian in James W. Croake. Dr. Croake conducted a demonstration on "Adlerian Family Counseling" at the Shoreline Community College on December 2, 1969. An expansion of exciting adventures is planned for working with families in the Shoreline Community in Seattle. Already, trained mothers are teaching classes in homes in three school districts. There is a possibility that a guidance center using Adlerian concepts will be established next year.

F. P. "Sam" Samples, second year doctoral student at West Virginia University, serves as consultant to the West Virginia Human Resources, Inc., a county counseling center, Fairmont, West Virginia. His work there primarily involves counseling--group and individual--with children and families.
