Dr. Felix Gruenberger is now in charge of the OPD for nervous diseases for the Joint in Shanghai. He previously worked in a Chinese Mental Hospital in Shanghai.

Dr. Elda Lindenfeld (Vancouver, B. C., Canada) gives under the auspices of the School Board a 48-hour evening course for Kindergarten teachers, for which the students get credit. Dr. Lindenfeld gives lectures twice a week for various groups. She is Vice-President of the Association for Scientific Treatment of Delinquency. She also organized a Counselling Service for parents and children at a neighborhood house.
