The *American Academy of Psychotherapists* held their Fourth Annual Conference October 17 and 18, 1959, in New York City, at which "Divergencies and agreements in methodologies of psychotherapy" was the topic. According to the program, the following therapists presented their orientations in answering five questions regarding treatment of the patient: Rudolf Dreikurs, Adlerian; Jule Nydes, Freudian; Laura Perls, Gestalt; Carl Rogers, Client-Centered; Carl Whitaker, Experiential. Each therapist also served as panelist in a discussion group in which the audience participated, and all panelists took part in a general meeting for mutual critique and rejoinders. Robert A. Harper presented the theoretician's viewpoint in introducing and concluding the conference.

Mrs. Lee R. Steiner was awarded first prize at the Ohio State Conference on Educational Radio and Television for her series "Psychologically speaking" on the New York radio station WEVD University of the Air.

Dr. Alfred Adler, author of *The Education of the Individual* (see Books Received) is a distant relative of the founder of Individual Psychology.

*Inferiority Feelings in the Individual and the Group* by Oliver Brachfeld, reviewed in this Journal, 1955, 11, 182-184, has been published in a third Spanish edition (*Los Sentimientos de Inferioridad*. Barcelona: Luis Miracle, 1959. Pp. 574). First published in French (1939), the book has appeared in Spanish (1944), English (1951), and German (1953). Compared to the English edition, the new Spanish edition represents a considerable reorganization and expansion of this broad survey of the Adlerian concepts of inferiority feelings and compensation, their history, influence, and application to various fields.

*Revista de Psicología*, published semi-annually by the Peruvian Society of Psychology, made its first appearance in June, 1959. It is edited by Leopoldo Chiappo who contributed to the May, 1959 issue of this Journal, and Segisfredo Luza. The first issue honors Kurt Goldstein in an editorial and articles by Honorio Delgado and J. Rof Carballo. (Dr. Delgado was a contributor to *Heilen und Bilden*, 1922 ed., edited by Alfred Adler and Carl Furtmueller.) The articles are provided with summaries in English, German, and French. *Dr. Stefan von Maday*, psychiatrist and associate professor, died on June 21, 1959 in Budapest after a long illness at the age of 80. One of the earliest associates of Adler, he was president of the Hungarian Society of Individual Psychology. According to Oliver Brachfeld, a co-founder of this society, it survived the Hitler period and World War II due to Dr. von Maday's able efforts. In addition to several books on Individual Psychology, as a young man he wrote a book on the psychology of the horse. In recent years Dr. von Maday devoted much of his time to the expansion of child guidance clinics in Hungary.

*Dr. Emil A. Gutheil*, died suddenly on July 7, 1959 in New York at the age of 60. As founder and editor of the *American Journal of Psychotherapy* he commanded the admiration of all in this and related fields, for the broad scope and world-wide coverage he had been able to give to this publication. Many papers by Individual Psychologists were published in its pages. Psychiatrist and author of many books, Dr. Gutheil was also the official translator of the works of Wilhelm Stekel whose most outstanding student he was. A native of Poland, he received his M.D. degree in Vienna in 1930 and came to the United States in the late nineteen thirties.
